**Peabody Elementary**

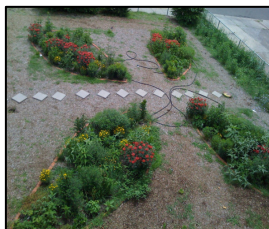
**School:** A series of theme gardens surrounding the entire school with some interesting environmentally friendly LID practices.
