<b>Responsibilities</b>
Attendance and participation at bi-monthly State Title I Committee of Practitioners meetings held at OSSE from 4:00 – 7:00 P.M. on the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Thursday of the following months: November, January, March, May, July, and September (first Fiscal Year 2011 meeting on November 18, 2010)
Attendance at up to 3 additional meetings annually when needed
Maintain 70% annual attendance rate at Committee meetings
Complete tasks as assigned by the full Committee
Review provided materials ahead of meeting dates, given 2-week notice
